## SHAREHOLDERS TO VOTE ON GOLDBELT ANCESTRAL TRUST

The Board of Directors recently approved a resolution in support of the creation of a settlement trust. Shareholders will vote on the resolution in the upcoming elections, and if approved, the "Goldbelt Ancestral Trust" will be established.

Under the terms of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, Alaska Native Corporations are able to create a settlement trust to "promote the health, education, and welfare of its shareholders, and also to preserve the heritage and culture of their people".

According to the resolution, the Trust will be built with assets that will fund such benefits as dividend distributions, scholarships, and death benefits.

"If approved by the shareholders, this trust will remain separate from the corporation and belong solely to its shareholder beneficiaries," said Goldbelt President & CEO Bob Loiselle. "As a result, the trust will be insulated from many of the business challenges the corporation could face. We hope it will create a permanent source of income to ensure that dividends, scholarships, and funeral benefits will remain available."

"Additionally, the Trust will also enable shareholders and the corporation to take advantage of some generous tax laws." One of the main tax advantages is that benefits, such as dividends, which are paid out to beneficiaries from the Trust's income will be considered non-taxable income. Also, the corporation will be able to make contributions to the Trust without any tax consequences and the Trust will pay the lowest marginal income tax rate of ten percent.

At a special board meeting in January, the board voted unanimously that beneficiaries of the ancestral trust will be limited to shareholders who are original shareholders or blood descendants of an original ANCSA shareholder.

Dear Shareholders,

I hope you all had a joyous Christmas and will have a happy, prosperous and healthy new year!

Management and staff are all back, hard at work after a welcome holiday break. Preparations are already underway for our 2013 audit and annual report. While our accountants are still closing the books, it looks like 2013 will be another solid year from a financial point of

view. We will have more to report once we have the audited results in early April.

This issue of the *Kookénaa* features very important information regarding the corporation's proposed new Goldbelt Ancestral Trust (an ANCSA settlement trust). Many of you may recall back in 1994 that Goldbelt proposed a permanent fund settlement trust which for various reasons was not approved by the shareholders. For the past couple of years, the Goldbelt Board has been talking about revisiting the formation of a settlement trust and recently approved drafting a trust agreement for consideration by Goldbelt shareholders at the 40th Annual Meeting of Shareholders on June 7, 2014.

The Goldbelt Ancestral Trust will have three primary purposes or "subtrusts":

- Cash Distributions
- Scholarships
- Death Benefits

These subtrusts will be funded over a period of time and not all benefits will be immediately available. The funding of the Trust may come from cash contributions or contribu-

tions of other assets such as real estate. Benefits from the Trust will not be taxable to shareholders so long as they are paid from the earnings of the Trust.

It will take a number of years before the Trust can provide all of these benefits because it will take time to fund it adequately. In the meantime, Goldbelt, Inc. will continue to make shareholder distributions and funeral benefits directly to shareholders while maintaining scholarships through the Heritage Institute.

The Goldbelt Ancestral Trust provides a separate legal entity which can safeguard shareholder assets from any misfortunes that the corporation may encounter. It will be governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of five individuals, including two Goldbelt, Inc. directors and three independent directors that have no direct ties to Goldbelt. This will help ensure that the Trust is managed in a manner that safeguards trust assets.

I personally have been involved in setting up and managing a number of settlement trusts over nearly the last twenty years and I can tell you from experience that this legal vehicle can pro-

This year, Goldbelt begins its **40th Anniversary** celebration. Congratulations Goldbelt! As we prepare for the future we look back on the events that have brought us to where we are now. We are grateful for the past and present leadership and ever mindful of the learning experiences.

When 2013's **Top 49ers** were named by *Alaska Business Monthly* magazine in its October 2013 edition, Goldbelt was listed as #22 with \$156,566,000 in business revenue. This is an increase in revenue from the preceding year.

On November 14, 2013, I was elected to serve on the **Native American Contractors Association's (NACA)** Board of Directors at their annual meeting. The Goldbelt board unanimously voted to have me pursue the NACA board position due to Goldbelt's significant revenues derived from federal government 8(a) contracting business. NACA serves its members as a congressional legislative watchdog that timely informs its members of proposed legislation impacting 8(a) businesses. Please join me in welcoming our newest employee and Goldbelt shareholder, **Steven Sahlender**. Steve recently joined Nisga'a's management team and his first assignment locates him overseas in Kuwait. Not only is Steve a Goldbelt shareholder, he has also honorably served our nation while in the US Air Force. We appreciate his service to our country and also value his participation in Goldbelt.

It is with great pride I write to inform you that on November 20, 2013, in a ceremony in Washington D.C. the Congressional Medal of Honor was awarded to **Tlingit code talkers** for their indispensable contributions as code talkers during the war. Yes, Tlingit code talkers.

You may already be aware of Navajo code talkers. After the US government declassified materials in the 1960s the

At this recent event, the Central Council of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska, along with other tribes, received the Congressional Medal of Honor for their indispensable contributions to our Nation. Congressional Medals were also awarded posthumously to the following Tlingits: Jeff David, Richard Bean Sr., George Lewis, Harvey Jacobs, and Mark Jacobs Sr.

Although they are no longer with us, their bravery and actions instill a pride in their families, clan, and tribe. Goldbelt salutes the Tlingit code talkers, Aatle'in Gunalcheesch.

At the November 23, 2013, board meeting, the Goldbelt Board of Directors approved a resolution asking shareholders to approve the creation of a **Goldbelt Ancestral Trust**. In the upcoming election, shareholders will be asked to vote on whether or not Goldbelt should create a trust. This will be a separate item to be determined by the shareholders with the decision announced at Goldbelt's Annual Meeting slated for June 7, 2014.

If approved, the Trust will be authorized to hold, invest, manage, and/or distribute funds for and on behalf of its duly enrolled Trust beneficiaries. Further details regarding the proposed trust will be provided at the community meetings in March. We welcome your thoughts and comments.

Goldbelt is proud to acknowledge shareholder descendant, **Daemon Cook**, for his outstanding academic achievements. Daemon is a senior in high school and has earned a \$11,000 scholarship as a University of Alaska scholar for being in the top 10% of his class with a 3.9 GPA. ## NORMAN'S CORNER: Tax Time & Understanding 1099-DIV Forms



**Q: What is a 1099-DIV form?**

*A: A 1099-DIV is a tax form used to report dividends and other distributions to taxpayers and to the IRS.*

**Q: Why do I receive a 1099-DIV form?**

*A: Under federal law, ANCSA corporation dividends are considered taxable income that must be reported when filing your taxes.*

**Q: How do I report the 1099-DIV on my tax form?**

*A: You will need to consult your tax preparer when filing your taxes. How you report your dividend can vary depending on where you live as you may also have to file city and state tax returns in addition.*

**Q: If my dividend is garnished, do I still need to report my dividend to the IRS?**

*A: Yes, this is a taxable income you received but was paid directly to the entity that garnished it such as child support.*

**Q: I am a legal custodian of a minor shareholder, do I need to report the child's 1099-DIV?**

*A: Depending on the total amount of the child's income, a parent or legal custodian may or may not need to report the child's dividend on their tax form. You will need to consult with your tax preparer to determine whether or not the child's dividend distribution needs to be filed.*

**Q: If I prepare my taxes myself, do I need to send a copy of my 1099-DIV Form to the IRS with my tax return forms?**

*A: No, you do not need to attach a copy of your 1099-DIV with your tax return form. However, it is a good idea to keep your 1099-DIV form on file in case you are audited.*

**Q: When is the deadline for Goldbelt to mail the 1099-DIV form to shareholders?**

*A: The deadline for the corporation to mail your 1099-DIV form is January 31st of each year. This allows time for Goldbelt to prepare the forms and mail them to shareholders. Please make sure your address is up to date so there is no delay in receiving your 1099-DIV form.*

"This is a key provision of the trust," says Loiselle. "It ensures that those who benefit from the trust are the intended beneficiaries of ANCSA."

While the Goldbelt corporate office will handle the administrative functions associated with the Trust, it will be managed by five trustees. Two of the trustees will be sitting board members, while the other three will be appointed by the Board.

In 1994, the corporation and then Board of Directors supported the passing of a settlement trust known as "The Goldbelt Shareholder Permanent Fund". The resolution did not receive a majority vote by shareholders.

"At that time, there was a lot of uncertainty with Goldbelt's businesses and NOL [Net Operating Loss] money, which had not yet been distributed to shareholders," said Loiselle. "All those issues have since been resolved and we feel the time is right to establish this Trust to ensure the longevity of benefits available to shareholders."

In order to better inform shareholders about the Ancestral Trust, Goldbelt will host a series of informational meetings for shareholders on the following dates and locations:

**Q: What happens if I filed my taxes before receiving a 1099-DIV?**

*A: You will need to let your tax preparer know you received a 1099-DIV form and it was left out of your reported income on your tax return. Remember, this is taxable income already reported to the IRS so failure to report it can result in penalties and future withholding from dividends by the IRS.*

**Q: What if I lose my 1099-DIV form?**

*A: You do not need the actual form to file your taxes. However, you do need to report the actual amount. Shareholder Services can send you a new 1099-DIV, or verify the amount of your most recent dividends.*


