Dear Shareholders:

Through the first nine months of 2009, your corporation remains strong financially, as most of our investments here in Alaska and those in the lower 48--our 8(a) Companies are realizing good financial results.

At the beginning of this year, we were apprehensive about the possible negative effect that the economy might have on the tourist season in Alaska.

Fortunately, Mount Roberts Tramway experienced its most profitable season ever, as the combination of

good weather and low price compared to other shore excursions, resulted in record numbers of tourists buying tickets, gifts and food at the Tram.

The Goldbelt Hotel had a solid season, however, due to the weak US economy, hotel occupancy was down from prior years.

First of all, there were fewer independent travelers visiting SE Alaska this summer, who normally utilize the hotels. Secondly, fewer customers were booked by Cruise West Tours this year. Their small-ship cruises now start and end in Juneau, and often require at least one night at the Goldbelt Hotel. As a result, 2009 for the Goldbelt Hotel--while profitable--will not measure up to the last couple of years.

As you know, our government contracting business through the 8 (a) program has been under attack by members of Congress and

the press. A hearing was held this summer by the House Subcommittee on Government Contracting during which we heard testimony by the Inspector General and some non-minority owned small businesses complaining about the 8(a) advantages in government contracting. In rebuttal, representatives from the Native American Contracting Association defended the program very effectively, so that legislation that was designed to curtail the 8(a) program for ANC's was abandoned, at least for the moment. Goldbelt is also participating with several of the regional corporations to fund a study by the McDowell Group which will advocate continuing with the 8(a) program as it is currently designed for Alaska Native Corporations.

We now have 11 companies engaged in government contracting, eight of which have 8 (a) status, and three more

## Financial Report – Victor R. Scarano, CFO

We are at the end of the tourism season and had a very sunny summer here in Juneau. That helped the profitability at the Mt Roberts Tram significantly. Overall, through August of this year Goldbelt, Incorporated and its affiliated companies posted \$3.24 million in Net Income compared to \$3.15 million generated through August of 2008. This is good news considering a fairly difficult local and national economy.



The Tram has generated \$1.3 million in Net Income through August of 2009 compared to \$574,000 through August 2008. The Hotel does not benefit as much by the good weather. It is more reliant on independent travelers and Cruise West which books a significant number of rooms each summer. Cruise West diminished the number of vessels and passengers going through Juneau in 2009, which negatively impacted the numbers. The Hotel has generated \$514,120 in Net Income through August compared to \$674,000 in the same period in 2008 so you can see the impact of reduced bookings. The Hotel has made some much needed changes to improve the property including a new roof, new carpet in the lobby, and new paint on parts of the exterior.

The government contracting entities continue to be a mixture of results. Goldbelt Raven and Goldbelt Hawk are having very good years posting net incomes of \$1.5 million and \$835 thousand respectively, which combined are ahead of budget expectations by over a million. While a couple of the remaining entities are not doing as well as last year, most are at least profitable. Overall, Government entities generated \$3.2 million in income compared to \$3.01 million during the same period in 2008.

We expect that Juneau will be negatively impacted by the diminished cruise traffic that will occur next year. We are heading into budget season and will be working hard to manage our Juneau properties to continue to be successful in the expected market downturn. The Government operations side is having great successes but also facing challenges. The Board and Staff continue to identify new opportunities and we are starting three new entities this year. We continue to refine and improve and this fall finds us beginning the Administrative Services Group which will ultimately centralize accounting, human resources, information technology and security services for our government entities thereby helping us be more competitive through diminished cost structure. That should have a positive impact on winning competitive awards and profitability.

## VPO Report: Bob Martin, Vice President Operations



As a result of the Supreme Court decision to reinstate the Kensington gold mine permit, activity necessary to get the Mine operational has been quickly ramping up. That means more people to transport and makes the construction of a marine facility at Cascade Point all the more important. Our 404 permit to build a dock is currently back before the Corps of Engineers, who are taking comments prior to re-issuing it. Following that process, we have asked the Corps to merge that permit and the permit that was recently issued for modifying the breakwater

into a barge landing facility. In the end, we expect to have a slightly re-designed facility that will allow us to export rock, sand and gravel as well as to support the transportation needs of the Kensington Mine.

Because we do not expect to complete the entire permit process this fall in time to begin work on the dock, we are making plans to lease a backup vessel that is capable and licensed to load and unload off the beach. During the bad weather days that we know will happen this winter when we cannot operate a boat from Yankee Cove, we can use the backup vessel to load people adjacent to the launch ramp at Echo Cove for the short trip across Berners Bay.

We have also been concerned that the District Court had not yet entered a final judgment on the SEAAC suit against the Corps of Engineers and Coeur pending reports from the parties involved. We had been worried that opponents to the project would find some way to challenge and further delay the project. On Wednesday, September 30, however, we received the good news that SEACC has agreed to the proposed form of judgment.

Regarding West Douglas, the City and Borough of Juneau Lands Department has requested a meeting between the CBJ Assembly and the Goldbelt Board to discuss West Douglas development and the proposed road extension. This meeting was requested by Assemblyman Jonathan Anderson and will be discussed at the next CBJ Lands Committee meeting.

Our employees at the Tram, Hotel, Seadrome and GB Security are busy recovering from the busy summer season, preparing reports and drafting operating plans and budgets for next year. As reported by our CEO and CFO, those departments had a mixed year but still remained profitable.

Goldbelt Heritage Foundation has secured four grants totaling \$3.65 million which will help to enhance cultural and language preservation efforts and meet the needs of our communities for the next four years. The Foundation was recently awarded a three year language grant entitled, "Tlingit Flowing Through the Generations" which will fund development of language lessons to be shared with schools and the community. The project involves many of our fluent speakers including June Pegues, Anita Lafferty, Dr. Walter Soboleff, Helen Sarabia, Alfred McKinley, William Fawcett, Irene Cadiente, Nora Marks Dauenhauer, Lillian Austin, and David Katzeek who worked on our first language grant to help develop language resources to be shared with youth and community.

An additional grant was received through the City and Borough of Juneau Youth Activities grant titled, "Future Traditional Knowledge Bearers" which helps to offer cultural activities for youth through to June 2010. This grant helped to fund the August youth camp in a recent collaborative effort

with the Juneau Tlingit and Haida Community Council. The Foundation was additionally awarded a four year grant from the Office of Indian Education to support culturally responsive education efforts for Alaska Native high school youth. The project will work towards preventing students from dropping out by preparing them to advance on to higher education.

Goldbelt Heritage Foundation in partnership with the Juneau School District has secured a grant from the Department of Education, Alaska Native Educational Program entitled, "Wooch.een: Together We Can" to support the expansion of the Tlingit Culture, Language and Literacy program (TCLL). This program which has been implemented at both Gastineau and Harborview schools involves incorporating Tlingit culture, language and history into lessons that assure learning is culturally responsive, active and engaging for youth. The effort moving forward will be highlighted with an effort to make available curriculum instruction support and language to other schools within the Juneau School District. The TCLL program model has proven to be one that many educators, families and children hold in high esteem.

Alana, a student in Ms. Cristina Dick's 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade class shared that the Tlingit Language Culture and Literacy program "means a lot to me because I like learning Tlingit, singing, and dancing. The TCLL program is the only place that I learn Tlingit." The new grant will additionally help to build upon language instruction availability and support the involvement of traditional knowledge bearers, cultural specialists and elders in the classrooms with students. Children have enjoyed the instruction and sharing of knowledge by many within the community including Selina Everson and David Katzeek. The vision moving forward involves our best efforts to support the education of all youth. David Katzeek has shared that, "We would like to see all students unwrap the gifts of knowledge they have within each of them." When asked what has TCLL meant to you, Sierra, a 5<sup>th</sup> grade student in Ms. Cristina Dick's class responded, "If it weren't for the TCLL program, I wouldn't know any Tlingit language or history and culture. It means a lot to me to learn about the Tlingit culture during school."

are waiting for approval. All but two of the newer companies are profitable, and we expect to see those two become profitable by the end of 2010. Our Companies are engaged in activities such as training for the US Army, vehicle leasing, providing facility support services, construction and remodeling, operating an information technology (IT) help desk for US Army hospitals, and providing personnel to assist the families of National Guard soldiers KIA in Iraq or Afghanistan to deal with the tragedy.

One of the criticisms of the ANC 8(a) program is that we do not have enough participation by shareholders as employees of the 8(a) companies. Due to the distant location of these companies, it is very difficult to find shareholders already living in the areas and it is usually impractical for our shareholders to relocate to live and work in the areas where we are performing the government contracts. However, we think there can be more participation by shareholders or descendants. To this end, we are currently developing a plan for internships with our 8(a) companies, so that shareholders and/or shareholder descendants who have skills or interests that fit within these activities may have an opportunity to participate in this part of our business.

More information on these opportunities will be made available soon. Any shareholders who have an interest in this program, or know of shareholders who might be interested should contact Goldbelt's Human Resources department.

## Goldbelt 8(a) Subsidiaries

### ***Goldbelt has successful end of year at the National Energy Technology Laboratory***

Several of Goldbelt's 8(a) subsidiaries have been supporting the Department of Energy (DOE) National Energy Technology Laboratory (NETL) for the past 5-years under multiple contracts to include a Site Operations Support contract and multiple construction contracts. The reputation for quality and timeliness of delivery that Goldbelt earned at NETL has resulted in multiple contracts for both site operations and construction services to be awarded before the close of the federal Fiscal Year (FY) on September 30, 2009.

Goldbelt Eagle, with the support from Goldbelt Government Services Group management was awarded a 5-year \$84.5M contract to provide site operations and maintenance services not only at the two sites currently supported (Pittsburgh, PA and Morgantown, WV) but the contract added the NETL site in Albany, OR. The workforce at the Pittsburgh and Morgantown sites, although increasing in size, will remain a represented work force with minimal opportunities for new hires but the addition of the Albany, OR site will allow for a totally new workforce. Goldbelt Eagle, LLC has posted opportunities for experienced tradespersons (carpenters, HVACR technicians, electricians, and plumbers); mid-level managers, and senior managers on the Goldbelt, Inc web site ([www.goldbelt.com](http://www.goldbelt.com)) in an attempt to hire qualified shareholders. Goldbelt Security Services –Construction Division (GBSS-CD) has also had a successful end of FY2009 at NETL. GBSS-CD is currently supporting NETL with two renovation design-build contracts under which they are renovating a former circa 1950 laboratory building into a modern state-of-the-art laboratory and office complex. The design has been completed and the renovation effort is under way for the 2nd and 3<sup>rd</sup> Floors of Building 83 at the NETL-Pittsburgh site.

Goldbelt's newest subsidiary, Facility Support Services, LLC, (FSS) is going to be instrumental in these construction projects and will be posting a requirement for a Mechanical Engineer who has 5-7 years experience, is a registered Professional engineer and is a LEED-AP. This position will be located in either Pittsburgh, Pa or Morgantown, WV. FSS will also assume management responsibility for Goldbelt's construction program upon award of its 8(a) status.

These contracts were awarded under the ANC 8(a) program based upon not only demonstrated experience providing site maintenance and operations services and the design and construction/renovation of facilities but having a competitive cost. Additional information will be provided in future newsletters as the projects progress.
